

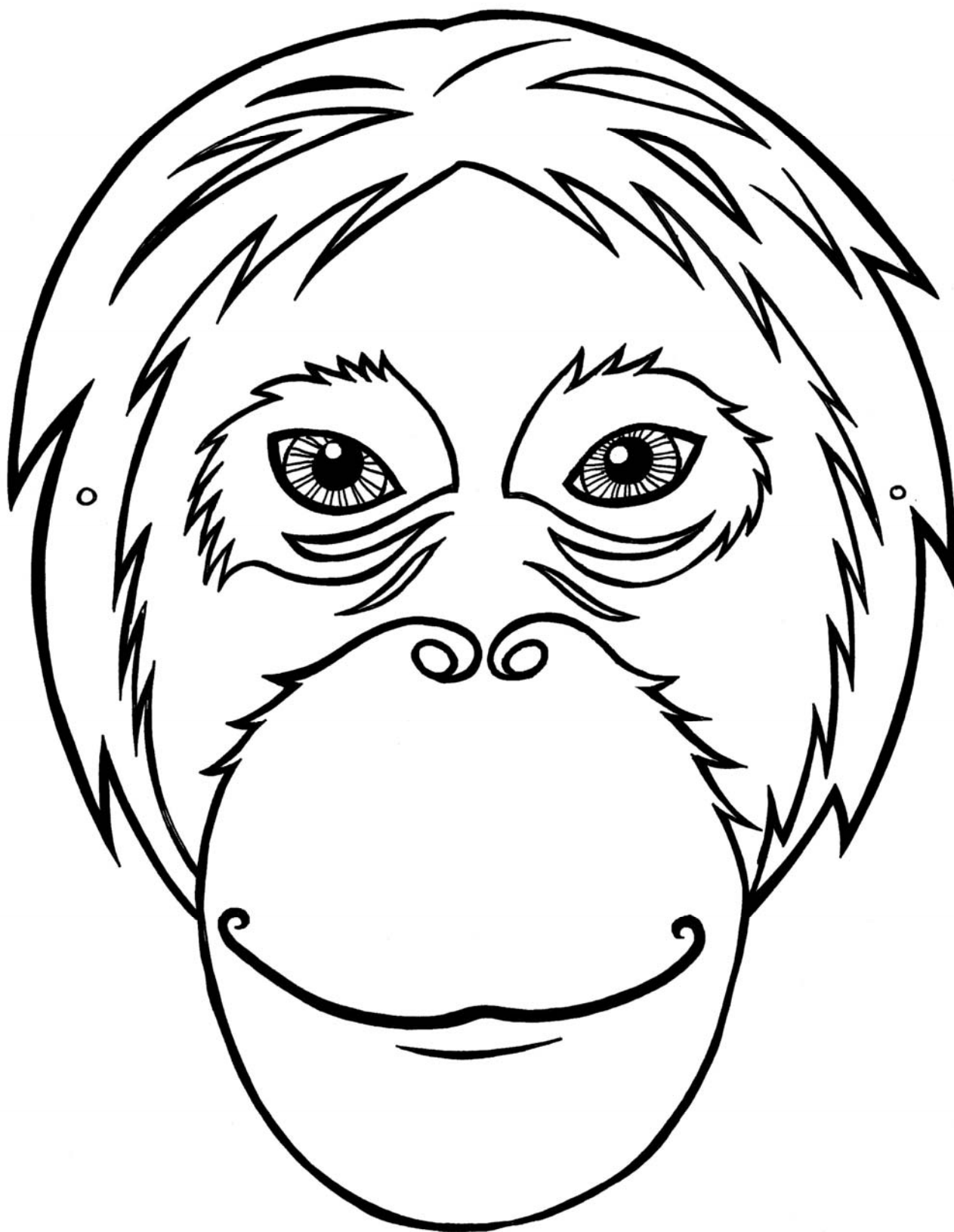

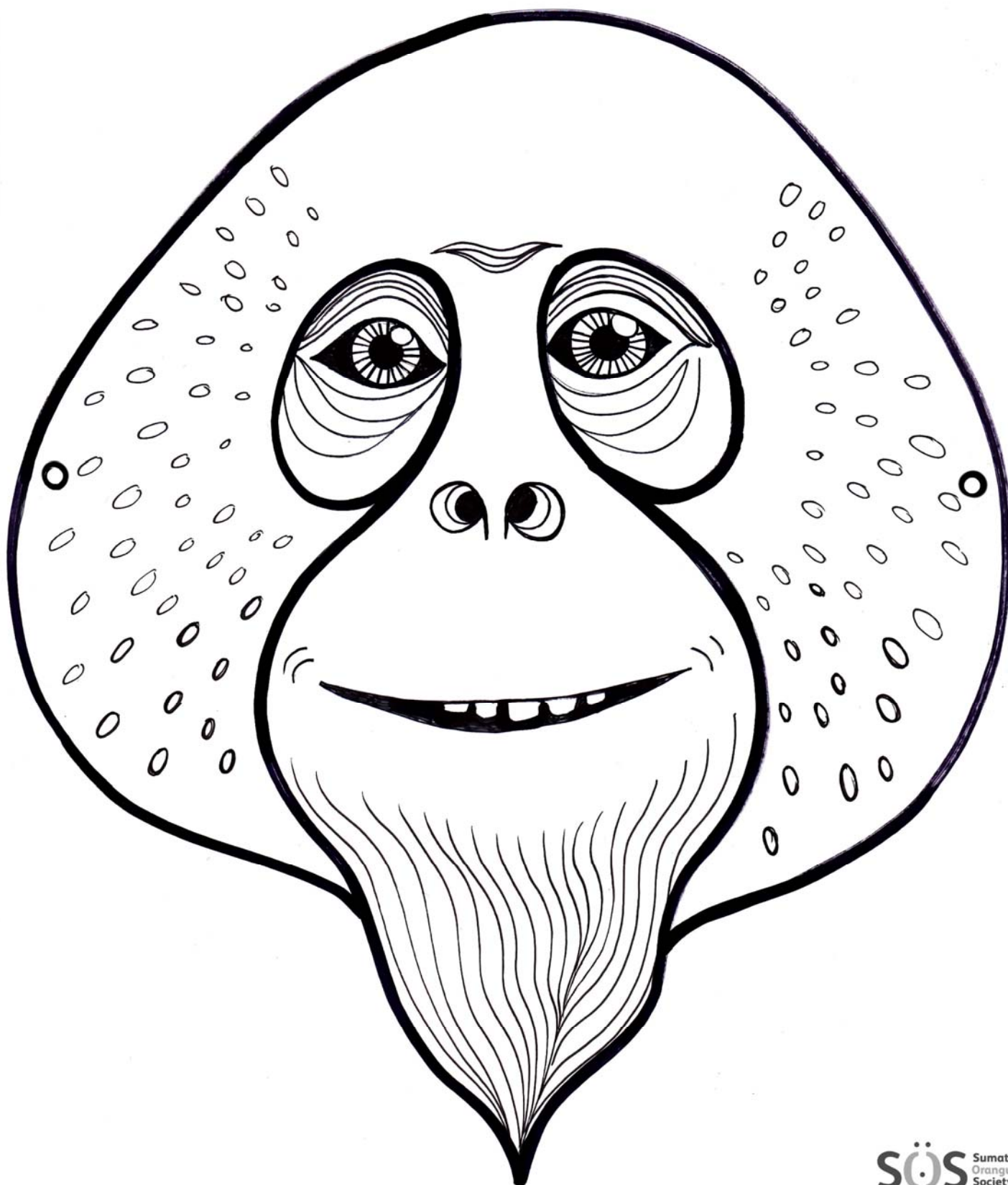
A female orangutan mask to colour and cut out

Sticking this page to card before cutting out will make the face stronger to use as a mask. There are holes on the side to attach string.



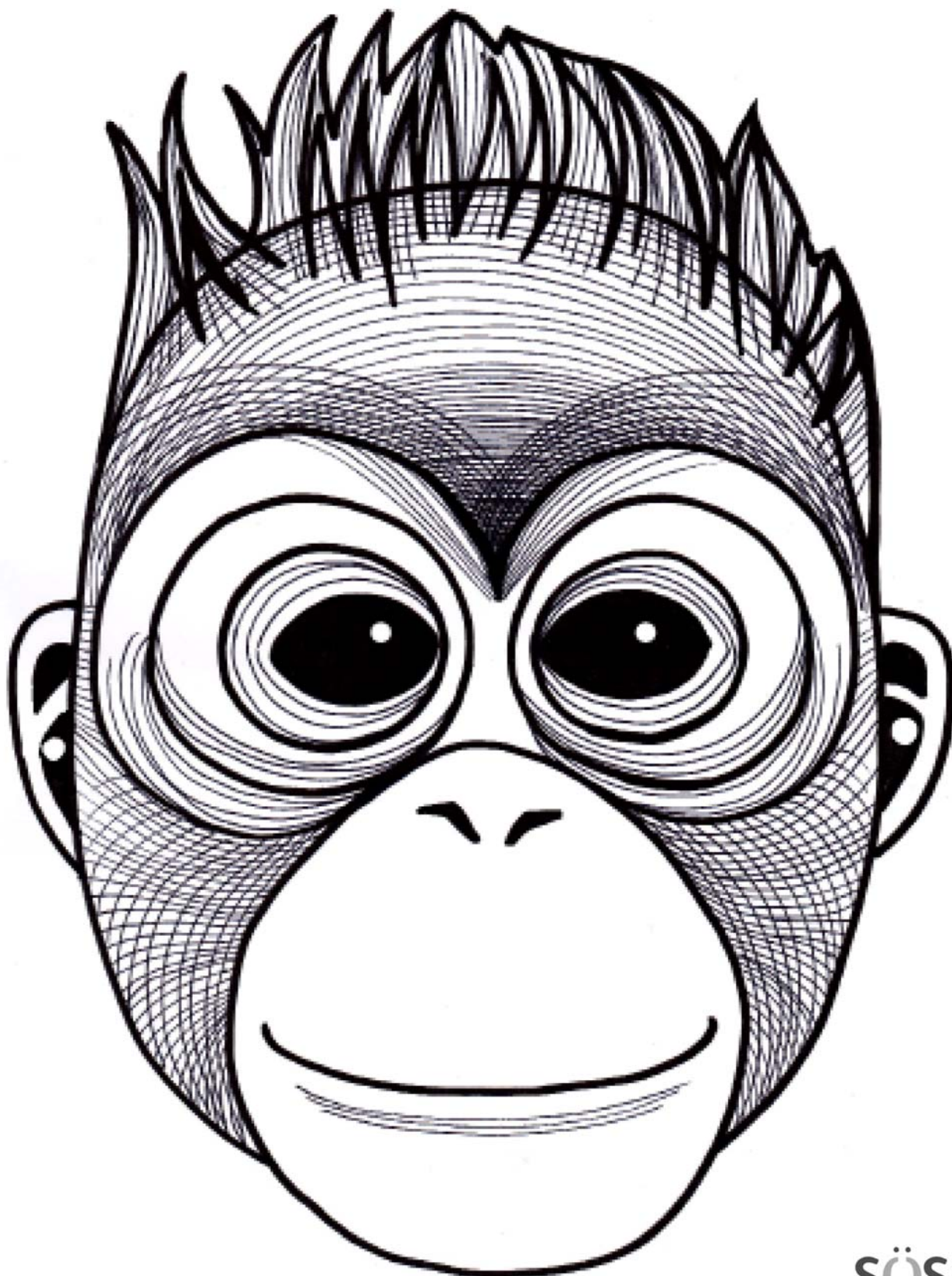
A male orangutan mask to colour and cut out

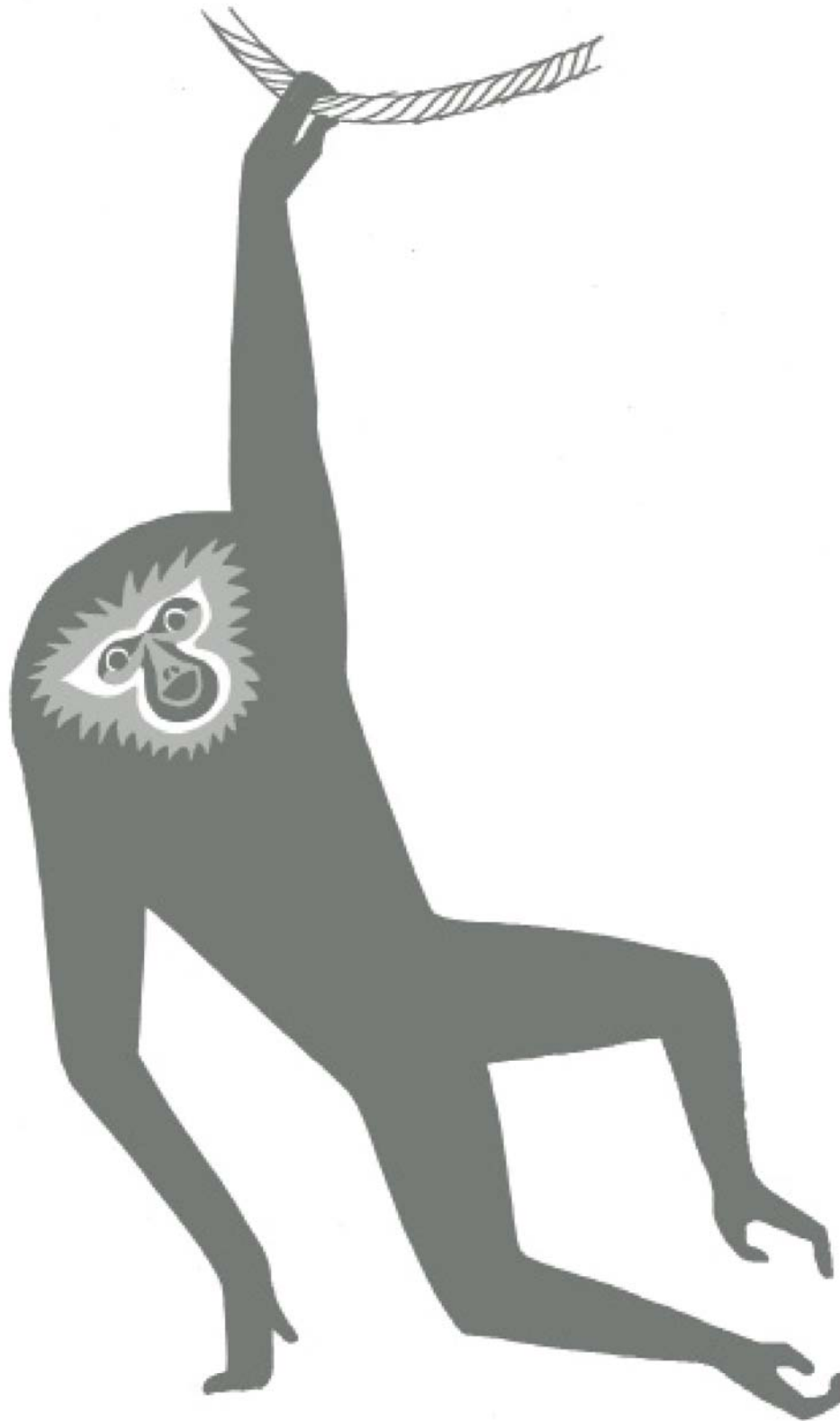

Where do I live?

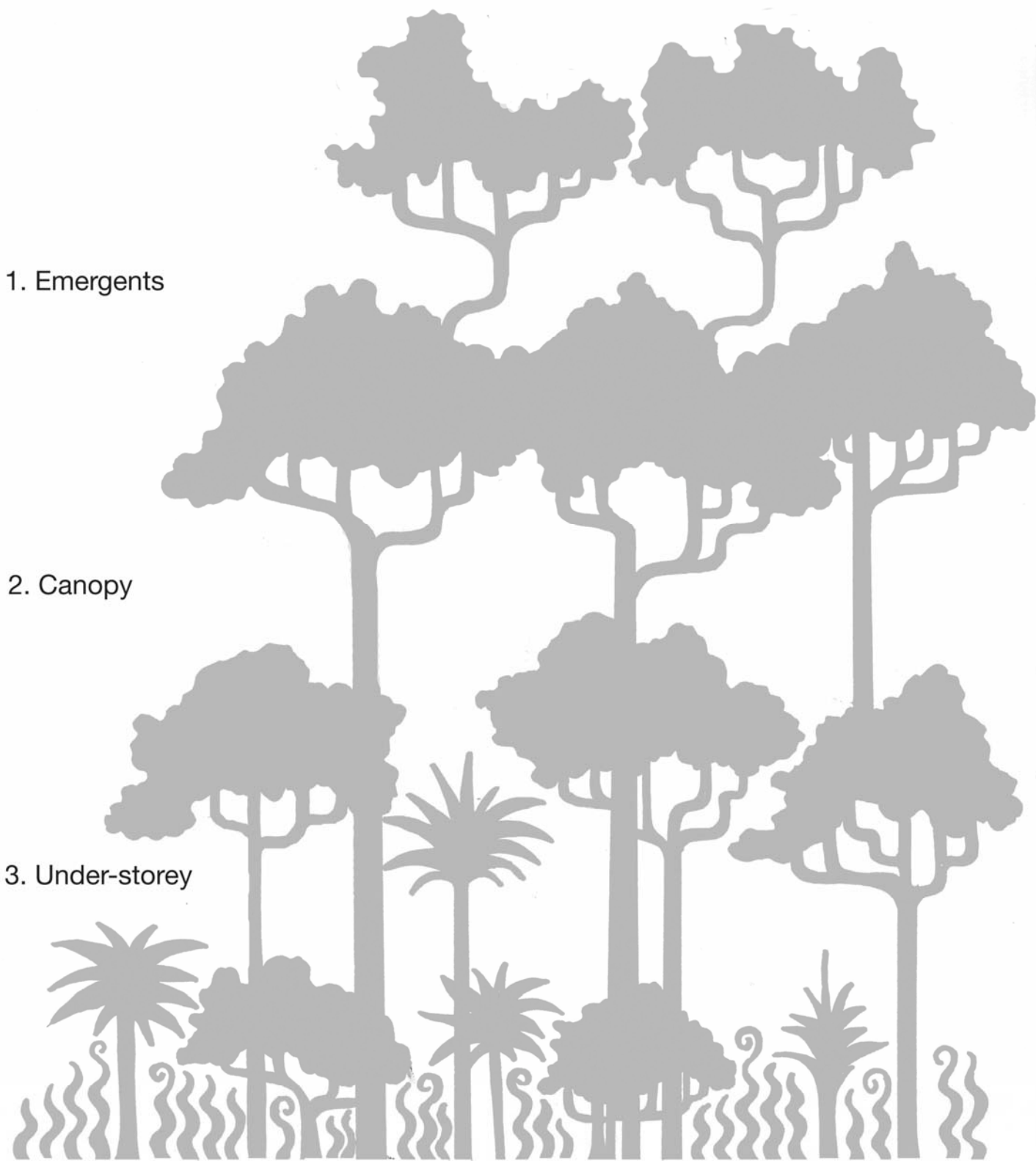
There are four layers to the rainforest and they are called:

4. Forest floor

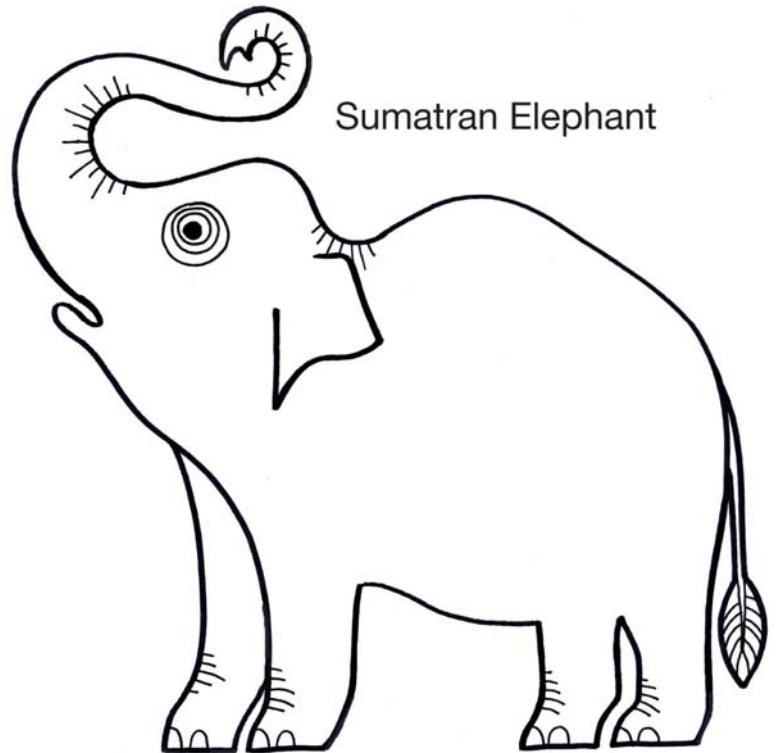


Colour in and cut out these four animals then stick them onto the part of the rainforest you think they live.

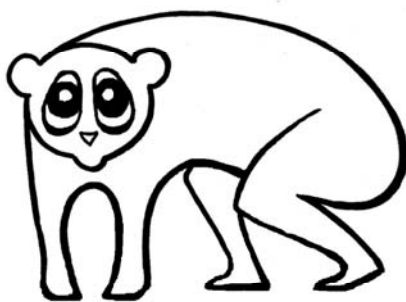

Life in the Sumatran Rainforest

Half the Earth's species live in rainforests. These perfectly balanced ecosystems are home to a complex web of life, with the plants, animals and indigenous people all relying on the forests, and each other, for survival. Take a closer look at the wonders of the Sumatran rainforest...

Gardeners of the Forest

Orangutans play a key role in preserving the Indonesian forests. They eat fruits and leaves then pass them in their dung to spread the seeds for new trees. They also swing around breaking off branches for nests, letting sunlight reach new plants on the ground.

People of the Forest

The rainforest provides shelter, food, medicine and protection from drought and flooding for the humans that live there too. Local people as well as wildlife suffer when the rainforests are destroyed.

Tree of life

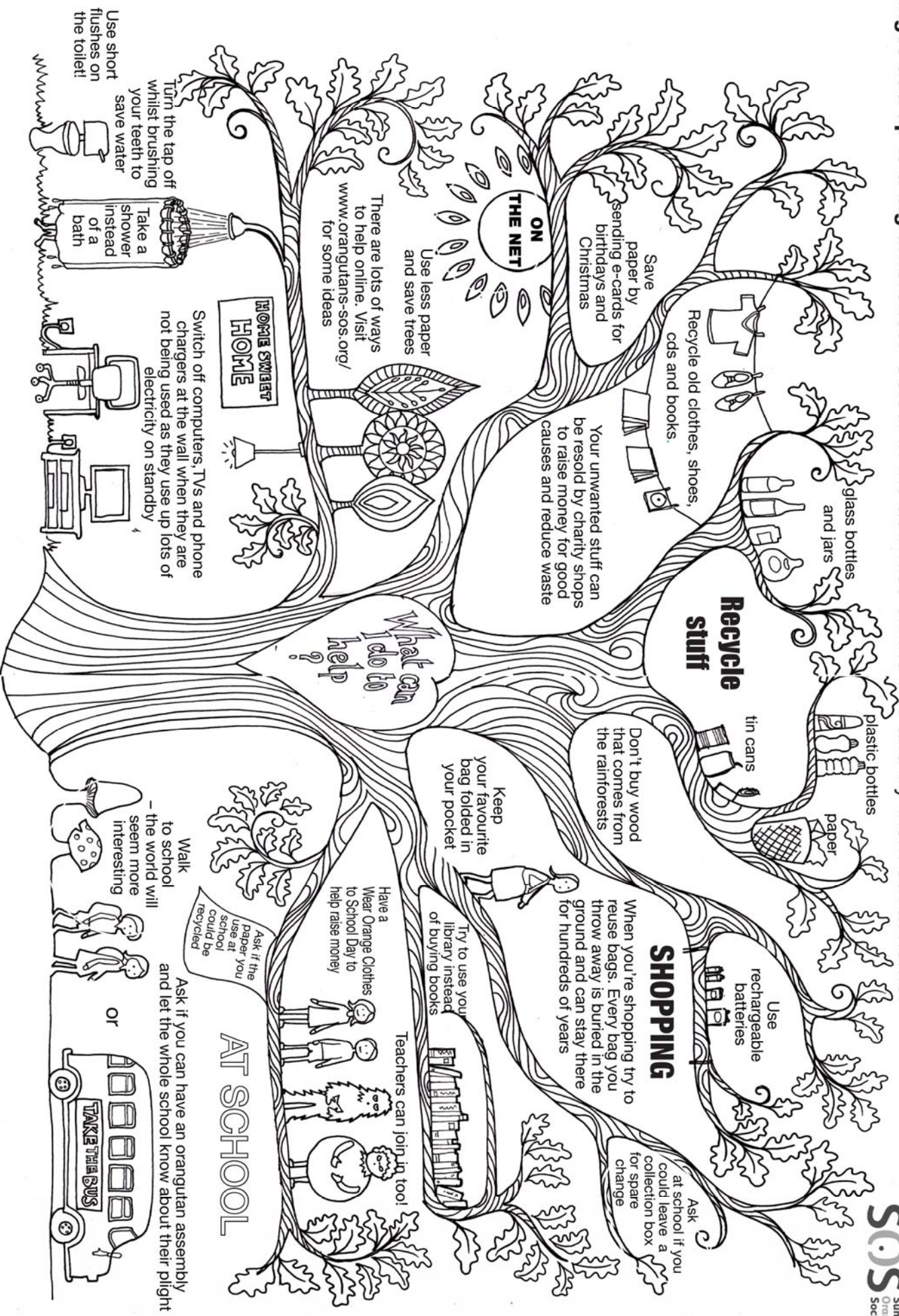
The Earth's rainforests produce oxygen for humans to breathe, and absorb carbon dioxide from the air. Trees also release lots of water vapour into the air. This forms clouds which turn into rain, watering crops around the world.

Small but mighty

Ants, spiders, worms and beetles keep the soil healthy. They eat dead plants and animals and release nutrients back into the earth.
